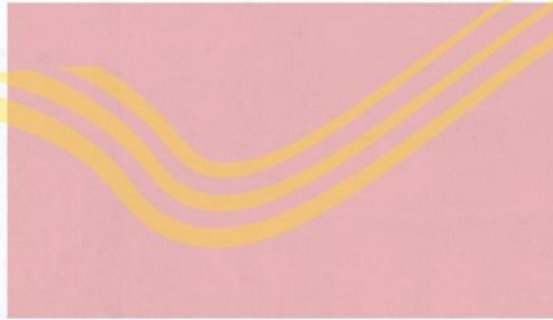

Together Towards Transformation

The Minister for Communications and Development of North Eastern Region, Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, held a detailed interactive session with Postal and Sorting Assistants on 2nd July, 2025. Representing all 23 postal circles from across the country, these frontline workers form the backbone of the Department of Posts (DoP).

The Union Minister appreciated their crucial role in delivering citizen-centric services and implementing key social security schemes. He acknowledged their daily efforts in managing customer needs and maintaining the smooth flow of communication across the nation.

During the session, the Union Minister outlined the vision to transform India Post into a profit centre. He emphasised the need for close coordination across all the key verticals: Mails, Parcels, International Mails, Savings Bank, Insurance, and Citizen-Centric Services to be a one-stop solution for customers. This coordinated approach, he noted, will help drive innovation, improve efficiency, and ensure long-term sustainability across the postal network.

“We are committed to making India Post a cutting-edge organisation. But this transformation is only possible if we all move forward together. I am with you on this journey,” the Union Minister said, underlining his support for the workforce in driving this vision.

He also spoke about the ongoing implementation of the IT 2.0 project, emphasising that this initiative will modernise the postal sector to make it faster, more transparent, and aligned with the highest industry standards. He also discussed the launch of the Digital Address Code, an initiative aimed at establishing a standardised, geo-coded addressing system for India.



The Union Minister urged everyone to embrace this change and contribute to the Department's digital transformation. He encouraged everyone to gear up for a more digital and integrated work environment. Their ability to adopt new tools, assist customers, and provide real-time feedback will be essential for smooth and successful implementation.

Looking ahead, he shared the Department's roadmap to becoming a major public logistics organisation. The goal is to position India Post as a profit centre, backed by consistent efforts in revenue generation. He encouraged them to continue working towards a modern, efficient, and people-first postal system, in the true spirit of the Department's motto, Dak Sewa, Jan Sewa.



Gramin Dak Sevak Sammelan: Celebrating the Spirit That Connects India

The Union Minister of Communications and DoNER, Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, addressed a charged gathering on 10th July, 2025 at the Gramin Dak Sevak Sammelan in Bengaluru, Karnataka, rekindling a powerful emotional connect with the Dak Parivaar and setting a bold roadmap for the future of India Post. Underscoring the unmatched reach of the postal network, he noted that there is no other distribution channel in the world as wide and deeply connected as India Post with over 1.64 lakh touchpoints stretching from Kashmir to Kanyakumari, Bharuch to Dharmanagar.

He emphasised how true transformation begins when every worker feels personally invested in the mission. While addressing the Gramin Dak Sevaks, he spoke of how they are the pillars of trust in every village and are deeply and emotionally connected to every household in the rural belt.

He further highlighted the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's vision to redesign post offices for a more citizen-centric experience, and reaffirmed the commitment to make post offices the front door of governance in rural India, accessible, modern, and service-rich.



India Post Business Meet 2025-26

On 15th July, 2025, the Department of Posts convened its Annual Business Meet 2025–26 in New Delhi under the leadership of the Union Minister of Communications and DoNER Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia. This strategic gathering brought together Heads of Circles from across the country to deliberate on the roadmap for India Post's business transformation and its evolving role as a premium logistics and citizen-centric service provider.

During the meeting, all Circle Heads presented their business performance, regional initiatives, challenges, and strategies to accelerate growth. These presentations underscored the vibrant, grassroots efforts underway to align with national priorities and enhance India Post's capabilities in logistics, banking, e-commerce, and public service delivery.

Shri Scindia engaged deeply with the delegates, listening intently to the developments, hurdles, and aspirations of each region. In his address, he reiterated India Post's vital role in bridging the rural-urban divide and strengthening inclusive growth through robust logistics, financial inclusion, and digital connectivity.

Further, he set an ambitious growth target of 20% to 30% for FY 2025–26 across different Circles, tailored to their potential in specific verticals. This goal is part of a broader mission to transform India Post into a sustainable profit centre for the Government of India, without compromising its social responsibility.

The discussions also focused on infrastructure development, process simplification, capacity-building, and digital enablement and all essential components in positioning India Post as a future-ready, last-mile logistics and service powerhouse.

The Annual Business Meet concluded with a strong collective resolve to drive business growth, leverage technology, and foster a culture of service, innovation, and excellence throughout the organisation.



Strengthening Last-Mile Access with Modern Postal Services

Hon'ble Minister of State for Communications and Rural Development, Dr. Chandra Sekhar Pemmasani, inaugurated the new Razole Head Post Office building in the Konaseema district of Andhra Pradesh. Built to serve the people of Razole and nearby villages, the facility marks a step forward in India Post's mission to deliver citizen-centric, state-of-the-art services at the grassroots. During his address, the Hon'ble Minister stated, "India has two PMs: one is our Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, and the other is the 'Postman' in every village who ensures that services reach the last mile."

In the same spirit of rural empowerment, the Peddapuram Sub Post Office under the Kakinada Division was also inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister. He emphasised the rapid modernisation within India Post, enabling real-time SMS alerts on article booking and delivery, robust article tracking systems, and improved technological infrastructure to compete with private service providers in the market.



India Post IT 2.0 in Motion

In a significant step toward modernising one of India's most enduring public institutions on 30th July, 2025, Dr. Chandra Sekhar Pemmasani, Union Minister of State for Communications and Rural Development, chaired a high-level review of the Mail Operations, Parcel Operations, and Business Strategy divisions of the Department of Posts.

The strategic review is part of a broader reform agenda of the Government of India, under the capable leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, Union Minister of Communications and Minister for the Development of the North Eastern Region (DONER). This initiative aims to reposition India Post as a technology-driven, citizen-centric logistics and e-commerce enabler.

India Post is currently undergoing a comprehensive, technology-driven transformation under the IT 2.0 framework. This initiative is part of a strategic roadmap aimed at positioning India Post as a strong competitor in the logistics industry, especially in the rapidly expanding e-commerce parcel delivery sector.

Upgrades have been designed to introduce real-time track and trace capabilities, customised services for bulk customers, electronic proof of delivery, OTP-based authentication, digital payments, and open API integration. The entire network of approximately 165,000 post offices is migrating to the new platform.

In line with industry best practices, the Department has introduced centralised delivery for all categories of mail and parcels by setting up dedicated Delivery Centres that consolidate the service areas of existing post offices. A total of 344 Delivery Centres have been launched nationwide during Phase 1.

One of the core pillars of this transformation is the integration of India Post's systems with major national digital commerce ecosystems. According to officials, the Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC) will enable wallet-based prepaid bookings, centralised order tracking, and automated reconciliation with ONDC's accounting systems.

Through its collaboration with the Government e-Marketplace (GeM), India Post will provide API-driven automated pricing and centralised dashboards for payment tracking and cash-on-delivery (COD) settlements.

A Hall of Legacy and Leadership



Ms. Vandita Kaul, Secretary (Posts), inaugurated the newly renovated G.P. Roy Committee Hall at Dak Bhawan, New Delhi on 25th July, 2025. The hall is named in honour of Ganendra Prosad Roy, the first Indian to serve as Director General of Posts and Telegraphs, which was a landmark moment in the history of the Department of Posts.

This year also marks the centenary of his appointment, making the occasion even more noteworthy. The Committee Hall is now equipped to host future high-level conferences of India Post.

The World's Only Floating Post Office

The experience becomes a cherished memory, often captured with a picture beside the wooden shikara-style post office floating calmly on the water.

Over the years, this floating branch has become a symbol of India Post's commitment and Kashmir's cultural pride. It preserves the legacy of the valley, making it a beloved stop for tourists and a trusted institution for locals.

Partnering to Serve India Better



On 24th July, 2025, the Department of Posts signed a Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA) with NPCI International Payments Limited. The collaboration aims to explore the enablement of foreign inward remittances to India via UPI through the postal network. This strategic alliance will help enhance financial inclusion and simplify cross-border money transfers.

The NDA was signed by Mr Lakshmikanta Dash, DDG (International Relations and Global Business), on behalf of the Department of Posts, and Mr Ritesh Shukla, MD and CEO of NPCI International Payments Limited.



The Department of Posts signed an MoU on 17th July, 2025 with the Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI) to offer KYC verification services through its 1.64 lakh+ post offices, ensuring smooth compliance for mutual fund investors.

The MoU was signed by Ms. Manisha Bansal Badal, GM (Business Development), on behalf of the Department of Posts, and Mr. V.N. Chalasani, Chief Executive, AMFI.



On 30th July, 2025, an MoU was signed between India Post and NBCC (India) Ltd. in the presence of Shri Jitendra Gupta, Director General (Posts), Dr. Suman Kumar, Director (Commercial), NBCC and senior officials from both DoP and NBCC. The MoU aims to initiate feasibility studies of identified unutilized or underutilised properties and land parcels as a stepping stone to unlock their full potential and enhance long-term value for the Department.



The Department of Posts entered into a strategic contract with IIM Bangalore on 25th July, 2025 to collaborate on the Digital Address Ecosystem. This partnership aims to support the development of the proposed Digital Address Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) and help realise its full potential.



India's first comprehensive digital address system

MapmyIndia has integrated DIGIPIN in the Mappls app to make DIGIPIN-based navigation a reality in India, thus facilitating digital addressing for a smarter, more connected India. This partnership goes beyond solving logistical challenges. It empowers over a billion Indians with a secure digital postal address, enhancing navigation, deliveries, and location sharing across urban and rural areas.

Accredited for Excellence



Minister of State for Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Dr. Jitendra Singh, awarded the National Standards for Civil Service Training Institutions (NSCSTI) Accreditation Certificates to all six Postal Training Centres. The recognition was conferred on 18th July, 2025 during an event the Capacity Building Commission organised. This achievement marks a major step in strengthening institutional capacity, advancing workforce upskilling, and setting new benchmarks in training excellence across India Post.

Progress in Motion



On 22nd July, 2025, India Post successfully rolled out Advanced Postal Technology (APT) 2.0 across all 5,727 Post Offices in Telangana. This includes 32 Head Post Offices, 689 Sub Post Offices, and 5,006 Branch Post Offices. The initiative aims to enhance customer convenience, transparency, and doorstep services through the integration of advanced digital tools. It brings several key enhancements across service categories. In counter services, features like UPI payments, real-time tracking, mobile booking apps, and e-Money Orders have been introduced to improve efficiency and customer experience. Doorstep services now include secure deliveries authenticated by digital signatures, COD collections via UPI, and even video recordings for added transparency. For online access, the Dak Seva Portal enables convenient mail and eMO bookings, while the MEGHA Chatbot offers user-friendly support. Additionally, interfaces for franchise outlets have been upgraded to streamline operations and improve service delivery.

From Paperwork to Paperless: The e-KYC Shift

The Department of Posts has enabled paperless transactions through Aadhaar-based authentication (e-KYC), streamlining the entire process from customer enrolment to financial transactions. The e-KYC functionality provides a paperless KYC process and facilitates POSB account opening and transactions using Aadhaar Biometric Authentication. At present, this functionality is available for onboarding new customers (CIF Creation) and for opening new accounts, including deposits and withdrawals, based on Aadhaar authentication. This initiative has significantly reduced transaction time and

ensured faster onboarding of new customers at the Post Office level. As of July 23, 2025, a total of 42,509 customers have been successfully onboarded through new account openings. Additionally, e-KYC and re-KYC processes have been completed for 5.43 lakh customers.

Lighting the Way to a Digital Future



We are entering a new era of digital excellence and transformation through IT Modernisation 2.0. To mark the successful rollout at Ambala GPO, the Chief Guest, Shri Sanjay Singh, Chief Postmaster General, Haryana Circle, and Director Postal Services, Haryana, Smt. Radhika Dhir Handa lit the ceremonial lamp and inaugurated the project on 22nd July, 2025 by booking two articles on the spot under IT 2.0.

Schemes, Services, and an Informed Start



During the orientation programme for newly admitted students at Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak, the Department of Posts organised an outreach initiative to raise awareness about various postal schemes and services. Professors, teaching and administrative staff, along with students, were informed about the full range of India Post's offerings. Pamphlets outlining key schemes were distributed to all new students. A detailed overview of major services was presented through informative banners, covering Sukanya Samridhi Account, Savings Account, PPF, Recurring Deposit Account, various Term Deposit Schemes, Senior Citizens Savings Scheme, Postal Life Insurance, Rural Postal Life Insurance, Aadhaar updates, and India Post Payments Bank services. The students showed keen interest in the schemes and appreciated the efforts of the Department.

Commemorative Postage Stamps Issued in July, 2025



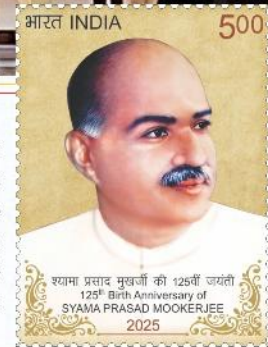

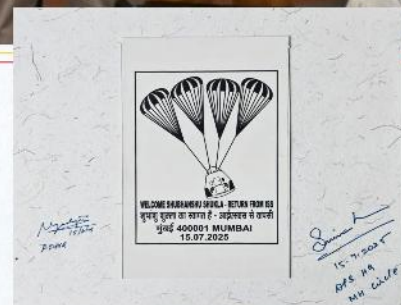




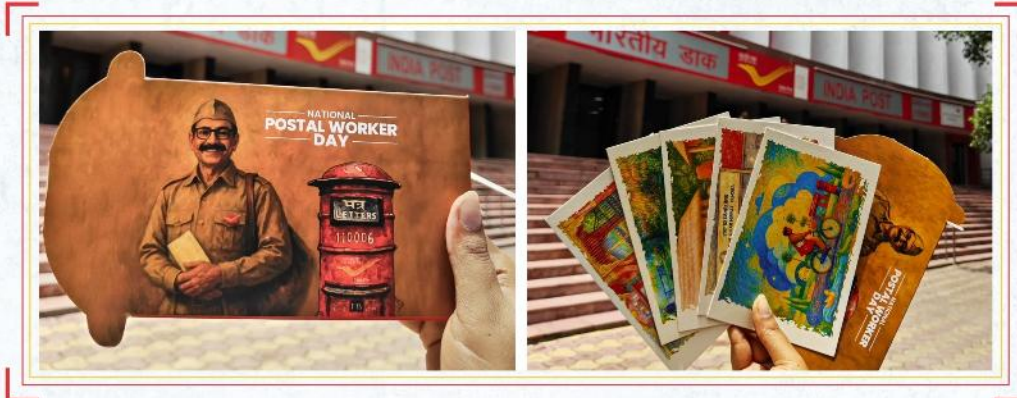

UN@80 Stamp Design Competition

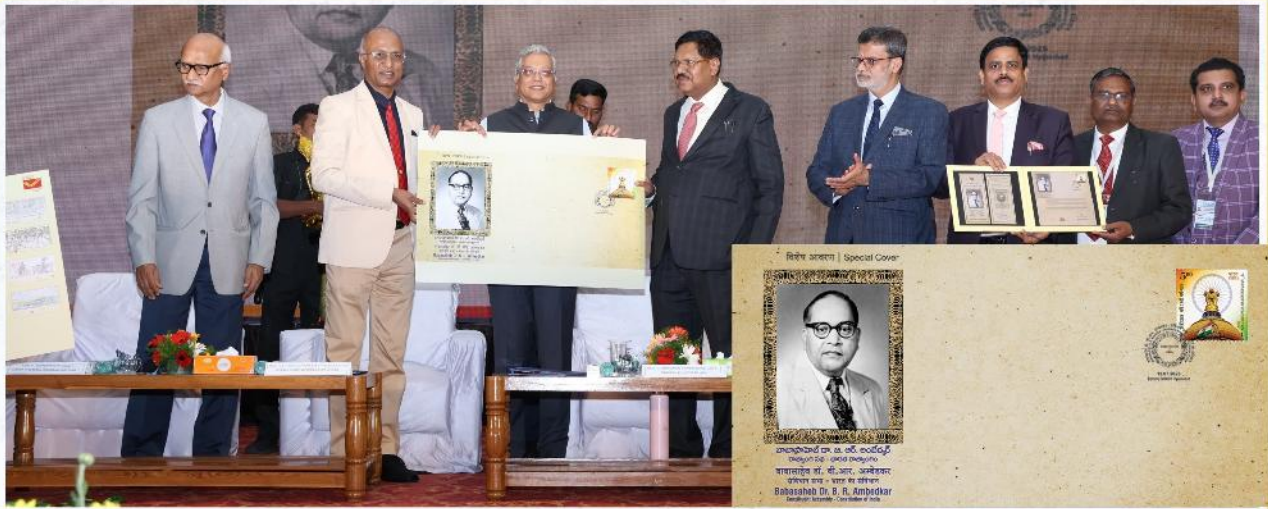
As a founding member of the United Nations, India has played a vital role in advancing the UN Charter and shaping the work of its specialised agencies and programmes. From sustainable development to peacekeeping, India's leadership continues to support multilateral efforts in addressing global challenges. To mark the 80th anniversary of the United Nations, the Department of Posts, in collaboration with the Ministry of External Affairs, proposes to release commemorative stamp(s) on behalf of the Government of India. As part of this celebration,

a nationwide stamp design competition is being organised, inviting students from across India to create a postage stamp that reflects 80 years of the United Nations and India's vision for a shared global future.

Celebrating a Grandmaster's Triumph

On 30th July, 2025, the Karnataka Postal Circle released a picture postcard in honour of Ms. Divya Deshmukh, recognising her stellar performance in the Women's Chess World Cup 2025 and her remarkable contribution to Indian chess on the global stage. The FIDE Women's World Cup 2025, held from July 5–28 in Batumi, saw a historic all-Indian final between 19-year-old Divya Deshmukh and GM Koneru Humpy. This marked the first time that two Indian women reached the final, and it is also the first-ever Women's World Cup title for India. Divya, hailing from Nagpur, defeated Humpy in a tense tiebreak after two drawn classical games. She also secured her first GM norm during the event, defeating top players like Zhu Jiner, Harika Dronavalli, and Tan Zhongyi.

Celebrating India's Constitutional Legacy



On 12th July, 2025, a Special Postal Cover was released in honour of “Babasaheb Dr. B.R. Ambedkar – Constituent Assembly – Constitution of India” and a set of 22 picture postcards on “Art & Calligraphy in the Constitution of India” at Osmania University, Hyderabad in the gracious presence of the Hon'ble Chief Justice of India, Dr. Justice B.R. Gavai, Justice P.S. Narasimha (Supreme Court), Justice Sujoy Paul (Acting CJ, Telangana HC) and Advocate General A. Sudharshan Reddy. The Special Cover highlights Dr. Ambedkar's contributions and features design elements from the original Constitution manuscript. The first Special Cover and Picture postcard album was presented by Chief Postmaster General Dr. P.V.S. Reddy, Telangana Circle. The Picture postcards reflect art by Shri Nandalal Bose, depicting India's cultural heritage through constitutional illustrations.
